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Dominion Energy Riverrock Announces Title Sponsorship Extension

Festival returns to traditional in-person format May 20-22

RICHMOND, VA — As excitement builds for [Dominion Energy Riverrock's](#) return to a traditional in-person festival this year, Sports Backers and Venture Richmond announced Dominion Energy's charitable foundation is renewing its partnership as title sponsor of the outdoor sports and lifestyle festival, extending its commitment through 2024 and bringing its total support to nearly \$3.5 million since the festival's inception in 2009.

The announcement occurred during a kickoff event at Hardywood Park Craft Brewery's Richmond Brew House on March 16. Hardywood will serve as the new official beer provider for Dominion Energy Riverrock. The kickoff event featured live music from local artist Chris Leggett, festival partners from Richmond's outdoor adventure community, and remarks from representatives of Sports Backers and Venture Richmond, the nonprofit organizers of the event, and the Dominion Energy Charitable Foundation.

The debut of the short film, 'Where We Ride: MTB Trails in Richmond,' also took place during the event. The film was shot during the 2021 version of Riverrock with local riders at some of Richmond's top riding locations including the James River Park System, Pocahontas State Park, and Gillies Creek. 'Where We Ride' also features nationally-known freestyle and trail rider Jeff Lenosky and highlighted the unique mountain biking culture and community in Richmond. It was produced by Sports Backers and filmmaker Jack Anderson, a Richmond native.

This year's festival is set for May 20-22 at Brown's Island, the 5th Street Hillside, and the trails around the James River Park System. Dominion Energy Riverrock began in 2009 and is now the nation's premier outdoor sports and lifestyle festival, bringing athletes, spectators, musicians, and even dogs to Brown's Island for a three-day festival against the backdrop of downtown Richmond's urban riverfront.

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The festival is one of the region's most anticipated events and regularly draws upwards of 100,000 spectators and participants each year. Past festival participants include elite athletes such as Nathaniel Coleman, Kyra Condie, and Brooke Raboutou, who were all part of the U.S. Climbing Team in the inaugural climbing competition in the 2020 Tokyo Olympics, where Coleman went on to earn a silver medal in the Sport Climbing event. 2022 marks the first time Dominion Energy Riverrock will take place in its traditional format since 2019, after the 2020 and 2021 events took place in virtual and hybrid formats.

Dominion Energy Riverrock serves to promote Richmond's unique riverfront, downtown trails, and whitewater rapids to outdoor enthusiasts and introduce Richmond's outdoor adventure opportunities to residents from all corners of the region and visitors from around the country. As a result of the creation of Dominion Energy Riverrock, there is a stronger appreciation for the value of outdoor recreation throughout the entire Richmond region.
